This extensive exhibition presents more than thirty years of Karel Appel's production (Amsterdam, 1921). In 1948 Appel was one of the founders of the International COBRA group and, for his multiform and cosmopolitan activity, figures among the principal protagonists of contemporary European culture.

About sixty works will be arranged on the second floor of the Castle in the restored seventeenth century rooms - large paintings, sculptures of bronze and polychrome wood, the group of recent, previously unexhibited collages - which present in an organic way the best production of the artist, ranging from the "historic" works of the fifties and sixties to his activity of the last fifteen years, which is still unknown to the international public. The exhibition will also include the projection of the film "La réalité di Karel Appel" (Holland, 15 mins.). It was made by Jan Vrijman in 1961 with original music by the artist and Dizzy Gillespie and offers a rare testimony to Appel's pictorial technique and to his ideal conception of exchange among the arts.

The catalogue, produced for the occasion, contains writings by the artist, critical texts by the curators and essays by European and American scholars together with illustrations of the works on show.
